

Rockwood Neighborhood Council Meeting Minutes
May 5, 2005
St. John's Cathedral, Jewett House Auditorium
Spokane Washington

Meeting called to order by Chair Pam Behring at 7pm.

Minutes of April 14, 2005 were reviewed and corrected. Corrections were made to using Chair instead of Chairwoman and the spelling of Randy Hearst. Minutes were approved with corrections.

Committee Reports:

Historic Preservation - Marilyn Akerhielm reported that she continues to try and find people to work with, and combine her efforts with traffic concerns.

Traffic - Gail Prosser stated that until the Manito Center planning is completed, traffic work will move slowly.

Pam Behring announced that Paul Fitzpatrick resigned his board position with the Rockwood Neighborhood Council. A replacement will be nominated and elected at our June 2nd, meeting. This position will run through the end of 2005. At that time, the new Director may run for re-election.

Vice Chair John Prosser announced the dates of the next planning session which are as follows:

Plan Commission Workshop 12:30pm, May 11th, 2005, lower level of the City Hall. No public testimony will be allowed.

John Prosser reported that the Spring Clean Green went well. The volunteers filed two dumpsters with yard waste, and one dumpster for household garbage.

Considerable discussion was held on traffic in the Garfield and 29th area. It was the consensus of the body that our main long term goal would be to close Garfield at 29th avenue completely. Traffic Chair Gail Prosser was asked to find out the basic steps to obtain our goal and to report at our June meeting.

The Rockwood Neighborhood Annual Picnic will be held on July 7, 2005 on the lawn at St John's Cathedral. The Council decided to mail postcards to the neighborhood announcing the date of the picnic.
